49-51 AD Paul writes II Thessalonians from Corinth during the second missionary journey

52-57 AD Third missionary journey

53-55 AD Paul writes I Corinthians from Ephesus during the third missionary journey

55-56 AD Paul writes II Corinthians from Macedonia during the third missionary journey

57 AD Paul writes Romans during third missionary journey

57 AD Paul is arrested in Jerusalem

57-59 AD Paul under arrest in Caesarea

59-62 AD Paul is under house arrest in Rome

62 AD Paul writes Ephesians

62 AD Paul writes Philippians

62 AD Paul writes Colossians

62 AD Paul writes Colossians

63-64 AD Paul writes I Timothy

63-64 AD Paul writes Titus

64-65 AD Paul writes II Timothy, likely during a second imprisonment in Rome

55-65 AD Gospel of Matthew penned

55-65 AD Gospel of Mark penned

62-62 AD Gospel of Luke penned

70-100 AD Gospel of John penned
