

The "True" in John's Gospel: A Revelation of Ultimate Reality

- 1) John 1:9 That was the true <228> Light which gives light to every man coming into the world.
- 2) John 4:23 "But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true <228> worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him.
- 3) John 6:32 Then Jesus said to them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, Moses did not give you the bread from heaven, but My Father gives you the true <228> bread from heaven.
- 4) John 7:28 Then Jesus cried out, as He taught in the temple, saying, "You both know Me, and you know where I am from; and I have not come of Myself, but He who sent Me is true <228>, whom you do not know.
- 5) John 15:1 "I am the true <228> vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.
- 6) John 17:3 "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true <228> God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.
- 7) John 19:35 And he who has seen has testified, and his testimony is true <228>; and he knows that he is telling the truth, so that you may believe.

The "True" in John's Gospel: A Revelation of Ultimate Reality

John's Gospel uses the word $\partial \Lambda \eta \theta w \delta \zeta$ (alēthinos) (Strongs #228) to emphasize the **authentic**, **divine nature** of Jesus and His mission. This term doesn't merely mean "correct" or "accurate" — it points to what is **genuine**, **ultimate**, and **eternally real**.

Jesus as the True Revelation

1. True Light – John 1:9

Jesus is the **true Light**, illuminating every person. This echoes Genesis 1:3 — "Let there be light" — suggesting that Jesus is not just a source of physical light, but the **spiritual light of creation**, revelation, and salvation.

2. True Bread – John 6:32

In contrast to the manna in the wilderness, Jesus is the **true Bread from heaven**, offering eternal sustenance. This points to the **fulfillment of God's provision**, not just for physical needs, but for the soul.

3. **True Vine** – *John 15:1*

Jesus is the **true Vine**, replacing Israel as the source of life and fruitfulness. Psalm 80 and Isaiah 5 portray Israel as God's vine, but Jesus embodies the **faithful and fruitful Israel**, through whom believers are nourished.

The True God and True Worship

4. True Worshipers – John 4:23

Worship is no longer tied to a location but to **spirit and truth**. True worshipers are those who respond to the **reality of God's nature** with sincerity and spiritual alignment.

5. **True God** – *John 17:3*

Eternal life is knowing the **only true God** and Jesus Christ. This verse is a cornerstone of Christian theology, affirming the **exclusive and relational nature** of salvation.

6. True Sender – John 7:28

Jesus was sent by the **true One** — the Father. His mission is rooted in divine authenticity, not human invention.

True Testimony

7. **True Witness** – *John 19:35*

John's testimony of Jesus' death is **true**, given so that others may believe. This underscores the **historical reliability** and **spiritual significance** of the Gospel account.

Theological Thread

Jesus is the **true Light**, **true Bread**, and **true Vine** — each revealing a dimension of His divine role:

- **Light**: illumination and revelation
- Bread: sustenance and life
- Vine: connection and fruitfulness

He is sent by the **true God**, to call forth **true worshipers**, and is testified to by **true witnesses**. This progression shows that **truth in John's Gospel is not abstract** — it is **embodied in Jesus**, and it invites a response of **faith**, **worship**, and **transformation**.
